Issues for Follow-up

- ❖ Exploring Inter-agency mutual aid/technical assistance agreements to assist with engineering, manning, and operational issues; and, associated training needs.
- Crew retention & development relief crews, need for berthing spaces on RVs conducting 24/7 surveys during field season
- Communication of transient dockage information, costs, availability, problems, and options
- ❖ Developing training programs in conjunction with annual workshop



Actions from 2023 GLASS workshop and fleet assessment/science support workshop

Issues for Follow-up (continued)

- ❖ Become active with Smart Ships Coalition to learn more about regulations, control, and liability for autonomous vessel operations
- ❖ With Smart Ships Coalition, develop a mechanism to communicate the risks/rewards of investment in new AUV/ASV technology with early adopters
- Create a library of resources for sharing technology and engineering support expertise
- Consider GLASS role in implementation of the IJC decadal science strategy
- ❖ Develop common language (talking points) regarding the value and importance of the GL fleet in advancing regional science agenda



Goals for 2024 Workshop

- Discuss strategic and sustainable training opportunities through GLASS
- Continue dialogue on developing agreements to support vessel operations and maintenance
- Validate the need for consistent and uniform messaging and review draft language about the importance of the Great Lakes fleet
- Continue dialogue with Smart Ships Coalition about ASVs/AUVs and learn about challenges and opportunities regarding their deployment, use and regulation
- Hear from each other about successes and challenges over the past year
- Review GLASS vessel coordination action plan and plans for updating it
- Create one or more ad hoc committees to move these issues forward
